The Rev. Dr. Naim Ateek '66, '95 is a Palestinian Christian who lives and serves in Israel and Palestine. He was the first to articulate a Palestinian theology of liberation in his book; *Justice, and only Justice, a Palestinian Theology of Liberation*. The book laid the foundation of a theology that addresses the conflict over Palestine and explores political as well as religious, biblical, and theological dimensions.



From a position of faith, Naim seeks to find solutions based on the faith principles of justice, peace, and nonviolence, and has edited and written other books and articles. A former Canon of St. George's Cathedral, Jerusalem, he lectures widely both at home and abroad.

Naim earned his Master of Divinity degree in 1966 from CDSP. He then returned to Galilee where he started his ministry after being ordained priest in the Episcopal Church. He is the Executive Director of the Sabeel Ecumenical Liberation Theology Center in Jerusalem.
